COMPETITIVE EXPERIENCE

Started swimming competitively at the age of five.

Earned 2 state titles (1996-200 Freestyle and 200 Freestyle Relay) National Top 16 status (1996-200 Freestyle Relay), a State Record (1996-200 Freestyle Relay) placed in the top eight at state competitions (various) and qualified for Sectionals (2002- 800 Freestyle and 1,500 Freestyle).

While swimming for Plymouth High School, was Rookie of the Year (2002) MVP (2002 and 2003) and broke five school records (200 Free, 200 IM, 500 Free, 200 Medley Relay, 400 Freestyle Relay).

While swimming for Western Kentucky University, turned in multiple Top 20 performances, swam on a bronze-medal winning relay at Sun-Belt Conference (2006-800 Freestyle Relay) and won the Scholar-Athlete Award (2007).

Was the first recipient of the Dottie York Scholarship, a fund created to support aspiring Catalina Channel Swimmers that best embody the spirit of open water swimming (2010).

Became the 39th Person in the world to complete the "Triple Crown" of marathon swimming, consisting of the Manhattan Island Marathon Swim, Catalina Channel, and the English Channel.
